Dr. Lynette Stokes | *President, South Suburban College* Dr. Lynette D. Stokes was appointed in 2018 as the College President at SSC. As such, Dr. Stokes became the first African American female to hold the position in the college's 91-year history. She joined SSC in 2013 as the Vice President of Academic Services and has a rich history of 22 years in higher education as an administrator.



Dr. Brian Durham | Director, Illinois Community College Board Dr. Brian Durham is the Executive Director of the Illinois Community College Board (ICCB), holding that post since 2018. As the Executive Director, Dr. Durham works with the ICCB to provide coordination and oversight of the state's 39 community college districts. He works in close partnership with Governor Pritzker's Education Team, the Board of Higher Education, the State Board of Education, and members of the Illinois General Assembly, as well as the Council of Community College Presidents and the Illinois Community College Trustees Association.
